LAC 46:XXXIII.1611 "Continuing Education Requirements for Relicensure of Dentists" – The Louisiana State Board of Dentistry is amending this rule to allow current board members to obtain one hour of continuing dental education per each attended board meeting to reflect the learning experience they obtain during the year by reviewing numerous complaints.

LAC 46:XXXIII.1613 "Continuing Education Requirements for Relicensure of Dental Hygienists" – The Louisiana State Board of Dentistry is amending this rule to allow current board members to obtain one hour of continuing dental hygiene education per each attended board meeting to reflect the learning experience they obtain during the year by reviewing numerous complaints.

LAC 46:XXXIII.1709 "Examination of Dentists" – The Louisiana State Board of Dentistry is amending this rule to remove the mandatory requirement that an applicant with three licensing exam failures meet with the full board, requiring it only if deemed necessary. The Board has felt that some of these meetings were unnecessary in the past.

LAC 46:XXXIII.1611 "Continuing Education Requirements for Relicensure of Dentists" – The Louisiana State Board of Dentistry is amending this rule to allow current board members to obtain one hour of continuing dental education for each attended board meeting, reflecting the learning experience gained throughout the year by reviewing numerous complaints.
