In accordance with Section 953 of Title 49 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes, there is hereby submitted a fiscal and economic impact statement on the rule proposed for adoption, repeal or amendment. ESTIMATED IMPLEMENTATION COSTS (SAVINGS) TO STATE OR LOCAL I. GOVERNMENTAL UNITS (Summary) (LAC 46:XLV.416, 433, 441, 449 & 4005)

Notice is hereby given that in accordance with the Louisiana Administrative Procedure Act, R.S. 49:950 et seq., and pursuant to the authority vested in the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners (board) by the Louisiana Medical Practice Act, R.S. 37:1270, the board proposes, pursuant to R.S. 37:1310.1, Section 5(d), to add LAC 46:XLV.416, for those licensed pursuant to R.S. 37:1310.1, the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact ("IMLC"), so as to conform the information, data and oaths the Board receives from IMLC practitioners to match the information, data and oaths it already receives from licensure applicants who have applied for licensure, renewal and/or reinstatement under R.S. 37:1271-1291.1 and the Board's rules under LAC 46XLV.123 et seq. Likewise, the Board proposes amending LAC 46:XLV.433, 441, 449, and 4005 to require all IMLC licenses to comply with continuing medical education (CME) requirements pursuant to R.S. 37:1310.1, Section 7(b), similar to those already expected of individuals licensed under R.S. 37:1271-1291.1 and the Board's rules under LAC 46XLV.123 et seq.

The proposed changes will result in a one-time publication expense estimated at \$789.00, in FY 25 for the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners (LSBME). Otherwise, there is no anticipated impact on the LSBME or any state or local governmental unit, inclusive of adjustments in workload and paperwork requirements.

ESTIMATED EFFECT ON REVENUE COLLECTIONS OF STATE OR LOCAL II. GOVERNMENTAL UNITS (Summary)

The proposed addition of LAC 46:XLV.416, for those licensed pursuant to R.S. 37:1310.1, the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact ("IMLC"), so as to conform the information, data and oaths the Board receives from IMLC practitioners to match the information, data and oaths it already receives from licensure applicants who have applied for licensure, renewal and/or reinstatement under R.S. 37:1271-1291.1 and the Board's rules under LAC 46XLV.123 et seq. Likewise, the changes to LAC 46:XLV.433, 441, 449, and 4005 require all IMLC licenses to comply with continuing medical education (CME) requirements pursuant to R.S. 37:1310.1, Section 7(b), similar to those already expected of individuals licensed under R.S. 37:1271-1291.1 and the Board's rules under LAC 46XLV.123 et seq. Accordingly, there is no anticipated effect on the revenue collections of the LSBME or other state or local governmental units save for a likely minor increase in revenue from possible newly qualified international medical graduate license applicants.

ESTIMATED COSTS AND/OR ECONOMIC BENEFIT TO DIRECTLY AFFECTED PERSONS, SMALL BUSINESSES, OR NON-GOVERNMENTAL GROUPS (Summary)

While it is true the IMLC licensees will be required to complete approximately four additional pages of paperwork and attest to an oath before a notary, it is not anticipated that the proposed amendments will have a material effect on costs, paperwork or workload of those affected by the amendments, the physicians licensed pursuant to the IMLC law, by the LSBME, nor on receipts and/or income of licensees, small businesses, or non-governmental groups.

The board proposes, pursuant to R.S. 37:1310.1, Section 5(d), to add LAC 46:XLV.416, for those licensed pursuant to R.S. 37:1310.1, the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact ("IMLC"), so as to conform the information, data and oaths the Board receives from IMLC practitioners to match the information, data and oaths it already receives from licensure applicants who have applied for licensure, renewal and/or reinstatement under R.S. 37:1271-1291.1 and the Board's rules under LAC 46XLV.123 et seq. Likewise, the Board proposes amending LAC 46:XLV.433, 441, 449, and 4005 to require all IMLC licenses to comply with continuing medical education requirements pursuant to R.S. 37:1310.1, Section 7(b), similar to those already expected of individuals licensed under R.S. 37:1271-1291.1 and the Board's rules under LAC 46XLV.123 et seq. A copy of the Notice of Intent with the proposed rule changes, is attached.

In 2021, the Louisiana legislature passed the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact which provided another path to Louisiana licensure for physicians. Unlike the standard path to licensure, under R.S. 37:1271-1291.1 and the Board's rules under LAC 46XLV.123 et seq., the Compact, R.S. 37:1310.1, does not require certain information, oaths and/or continuing medical education (CME) from license applicants. It does provide however that professional boards may seek such information from the licensee after application. See, R.S. 37:1310.1, Section (7)(b). Thus, in order for the Board to obtain the same information, oaths and CME regarding IMLC licensees as it already does regarding its "standard path" licensees, the Board has undertaken this rule process.

Separate from the publishing cost, there will be a minimal cost to the Board for implementing these new rules, but such costs are offset by the license applicant's fees, as they are for those "standard pathway" licensees.

The proposed changes will result in a one-time publication expense estimated at \$789.00, in FY 20 for the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners (LSBME). Otherwise, it is anticipated that the LSBME licensure department will have a small increase in its workload and paperwork equivalent to the number of IMLC licensees who apply to the LSBME each year. This number cannot be ascertained in advance, but it is noted that the LSBME already does this same work as to applicants licensed under it is standard licensing process so the impact is unlikely to be unwieldy since the analysts are already trained in regard to this paperwork. These conclusions are based on the Summary of the changes in Item I above and Item A, above.

Physicians applying to the LSBME via Louisiana's new Interstate Medical Licensure Compact law, La. R.S. 37:1310.1 will be directly affected by the proposed amendment as they will be required to complete certain state-mandated CME, as well as certain forms authorizing particular Board regulation, and regarding their criminal history, practice of medicine, practice history, education history and competence related to their practice. Such paperwork and the notarization of, at most, two documents is only required once per year. Such notarization is anticipated to cost less than \$25.00 per IMLC licensee (most states set notary fees and usually an oath is set at less than \$15.00. https://www.nationalnotary.org/knowledge-center/about-notaries/notary-fees-by-state Louisiana is one of eleven states that does not set a fee schedule, so \$25.00 is an estimate). Otherwise, it is not anticipated that the proposed amendments will have a material effect on costs, paperwork or workload of those affected by the amendments, the physicians licensed pursuant to the IMLC law, by the LSBME, of licensees, small businesses, or non-governmental groups.
