To Whom It May Concern:

The Licensed Professional Counselors Board of Examiners has proposed amendments to LAC 46: LX.901. To facilitate the Department of Justice's review of the proposed rule, the Licensed Professional Counselors Board of Examiners provides answers to the following questions:

1. Describe any relevant factual background to the occupational regulation and the purpose of the occupational regulation.

The Louisiana Telehealth Act (R.S. 40:1223.1–R.S. 40:1223.5) mandates that each state agency, professional or occupational licensing board, or commission regulating the practice of a healthcare provider, as defined in this part, must promulgate rules in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act. These rules are required to facilitate, promote, and regulate the use of telehealth in the delivery of healthcare services within the scope of practice governed by the licensing entity. Additionally, the Telehealth Act authorizes each state agency, professional, or occupational licensing board or commission to establish reasonable fees for licenses or registrations through rulemaking.

The proposed rule will allow fully licensed counselors or therapists from other states to register in Louisiana to provide mental health counseling services if their license is unencumbered. The registration fee will be \$100, with a renewal fee of \$50. Additionally, out-of-state providers will still have the option to apply for an endorsement license to practice in Louisiana for a fee of \$300.

2. Is the occupational regulation within the scope of the occupational licensing board's general authority to regulate in a given occupation or industry? If so, identify the law that provides the authority for the rule and describe how the occupational regulation is within the scope.

In accordance with the Louisiana Administrative Procedures Act (R.S. 49:4950 et seq.) and through the authority of the Mental Health Counseling Licensing Act (R.S. 37:1101 et seq.).

 - Other activity: Active state supervision to ensure compliance.
- 4. Identify the clearly articulated state policy (e.g., health, safety, welfare, or consumer protection) in state statute, or any supporting evidence of the harm the action/proposed action is intended to protect against?

The policy of the Louisiana Mental Health Counselor Practice Act, as stated in LA R.S 37:1103, is that activities of such persons in the mental health counseling area should be regulated for the protection of the public health, safety, and welfare and to provide for the regulation of the practice of mental health counseling in the state of Louisiana.

5. Do any less restrictive alternatives to the occupational regulation exist for addressing the same harm? If so, include a comparison of the occupational regulation to the alternatives and a justification for not pursuing a less restrictive alternative. If no less restrictive alternatives exist, explain why.

The Board is not aware of any less restrictive alternatives. The proposed rule changes will provide out-of-state mental health providers with a reduced registration fee to offer teletherapy services in Louisiana. This may benefit Licensed Professional Counselors (LPCs) and Licensed Marriage and Family Therapists (LMFTs) by simplifying the process of practicing in Louisiana, provided they are licensed and in good standing in another jurisdiction. Additionally, this change could benefit Louisiana residents by increasing their access to LPCs and LMFTs.

6. Describe the process that the occupational licensing board followed in developing the proposed rule, including any public hearings held, studies conducted, and data collected or analyzed.

The Fiscal and Economic Impact Statement (FEIS) was submitted and approved. The notice of intent was sent to the Louisiana Register along with the required Oversight Committees. The Notice of Intent was published in the February 2025 Louisiana Register with public comments being accepted until March 14, 2025. The Board did not receive any requests or public comments and therefore did not conduct a public hearing.

RULE TITLE: Nursing Facilities Licensing Standards

I. ESTIMATED IMPLEMENTATION COSTS (SAVINGS) TO STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS (Summary)

It is anticipated that implementation of this proposed rule will have no programmatic fiscal impact to the state other than the cost of promulgation in FY 24-25. It is anticipated that \$648 will be expended in FY 24-25 for the state's administrative expense for promulgation of this proposed rule and the final rule.

This proposed rule amends the provisions governing the licensing of nursing facilities (NFs) in order to require NFs to access the certified nurse aide (CNA) registry and the Louisiana adverse actions list prior to hire and then monthly thereafter to ensure that a prospective hire or currently employed or contracted CNA does not have a finding.

II. ESTIMATED EFFECT ON REVENUE COLLECTIONS OF STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL UNITS (Summary)

It is anticipated that implementation of this proposed rule will have no impact on state revenue collections in FY 24-25, FY 25-26, or FY 26-27.

The state board will develop a database and licensure application for telehealth registrants, with an estimated cost of approximately \$50,000 in FY 25, funded through self-generated revenue. Chapter 9. Photographs and Videos

§901. Costs of Photographs and Videos Pertaining to Accident Reports

A. The following rules apply to the sale of photographs pertaining to accident reports:

1. Pursuant to R.S. 32:398 (E), the following fee scale shall be used for the sale of photographs and video/audio, body-worn camera (BWC) and in-car camera (ICC), pertaining to accident report.

a. For a proof sheet that includes thumbnails of all photographs, the cost shall be \$10 per sheet. Each sheet holds a maximum of 40 thumbnails.

b. For an individual photograph selected from the proof sheet, the cost shall be \$1\$ per individual photograph.

c. For an entire set of photographs (with or without purchasing the proof sheet), the cost shall be \$10 per photograph.

d. For a CD containing the photographs, the cost shall be \$10 per CD.

2. Photographs are available for purchase online at lsp.org, via facsimile to 225-925-4401, or via U.S. mail to: Office of State Police, Photo Lab, D-3, P.O. Box 66614, Baton Rouge, LA 70896.

3. Photographs and CDs will be shipped within three to five business days after receiving payment.

Licensed Professional Counselors Board of Examiners Teletherapy Registration Fee (LAC 46: LX.901)

In accordance with the applicable provisions of the Louisiana Administrative Procedures Act (R.S.49:950 et seq.) and through the authority of the Mental Health Counselor Licensing Act (R.S. 37:1101 et seq.), the Licensed Professional Counselors Board of Examiners proposes to provide licensed counselors or therapists from other state to register to provide mental health counseling services via telehealth if their license is unencumbered. The Licensed Professional Counselors Board of Examiners hereby gives Notice of Intent to propose changes to Chapter 9 Section 901 in the February 20, 2025, edition of the Louisiana Register.

Title 46

PROFESSIONAL AND OCCUPATIONAL STANDARDS REVISED Part LX. Licensed Professional Counselors Board of Examiners Subpart 1. Licensed Professional Counselors Chapter 9. Fees

§901. General

- A. The board shall collect the following fees:
 - 1. licensure application, license and seal—\$200;
 - 2. out of state licensure application, license, and seal—\$300;
 - 3. provisional licensure application and license—\$100;
 - 4. out of state provisional licensure application and license—\$150;
 - 5. out of state teletherapy registration—\$100;
 - 5 6. application for appraisal, board-approved supervisor, and other specialty areas—\$100;
 - 6-7. application for change/additional board-approved supervisor—\$50;
 - 7 8. application for expedited review—\$55;
 - § 9. renewal of license—\$170;
 - 9 10. renewal of provisional license—\$85;
 - 40 11. renewal of teletherapy registration, appraisal, board-approved supervisor, and other specialty areas—\$50;
 - 11-12. late fee for renewal of license—\$55;
 - 42 13. late fee for renewal of provisional license—\$55;
 - 43 14. late fee for renewal of appraisal, board-approved supervisor, and other specialty areas—\$25;
 - 14-15. reissue of license duplicate—\$25;
 - 15 16. copy of file—\$25;
- 16-17. copy of any documents—cost incurred.
- B. Late fees will be incurred the day after a licensee's designated renewal deadline (no grace period). No part of any fee shall be refundable under any conditions. The renewal shall be deemed timely when:

- 1. the renewal is delivered on or before the due date; or
- 2. the renewal is postmarked and mailed on or before the due date. The timeliness of the mailing shall be shown only by an official United States postmark or by official receipt or certificate from the United States Postal Service made at the time of mailing which indicates the date thereof. For purpose of this Section, "by mail" applies only to the United States Postal Service.
- C. The board may assess and collect fines in an amount not to exceed \$500 for violations of Chapter 9 and rules promulgated by the board.
- D. Senate Concurrent Resolution 104 of the Regular Session of the Louisiana Legislature suspended certain state law provisions relative to continuing education, annual applications, and/or annual payment of licensing fees for individuals on "active military service."
- E. Licensees who are placed on active duty status shall immediately notify the board of such status, and provide documentation of same, and shall likewise promptly notify the board, and provide documentation of the cessation of active duty status. Licensees with questions concerning the continued applicability of the resolution should contact the board office.

Small Business Analysis

This proposed Rule is not anticipated to have an adverse impact on small businesses; therefore, a Small Business Economic Impact Statement has not been prepared.

Provider Impact Statement

The proposed change should not have any known or foreseeable impact on providers as defined by HCR 170 of 2014 Regular Legislative Session. In particular, there should be no known or foreseeable effect on:

- 1. The effect on the staffing level requirements or qualifications required to provide the same level of service;
- 2. The total direct and indirect effect on the cost to the providers to provide the same level of service; or
- 3. The overall effect on the ability of the provider to provide the same level of service.

I. ESTIMATED IMPLEMENTATION COSTS (SAVINGS) TO STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL UNITS (Summary)

The state board will develop a database and licensure application for telehealth registrants, with an estimated cost of approximately \$50,000 in FY 25, funded through self-generated revenue. Rulemaking, which involves publishing the proposed and final rule in the *Louisiana Register*, is expected to cost approximately \$800 in FY 25.

II. ESTIMATED EFFECT ON REVENUE COLLECTIONS OF STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL UNITS (Summary)

If more individuals from other states seek registration to practice teletherapy in Louisiana under the new regulation, licensure fee revenues for the Louisiana Licensed Professional Counselors Board may increase correspondingly. However, the extent of this potential increase is currently indeterminable. Conversely, if out-of-state licensees allow their existing endorsement licenses to expire and instead opt to pay the registration fee for teletherapy privileges, the board's revenue could decrease. The magnitude of this potential decrease is also indeterminable.

III. ESTIMATED COSTS AND/OR ECONOMIC BENEFITS TO DIRECTLY AFFECTED PERSONS OR NON-GOVERNMENTAL GROUPS (Summary)

The proposed rule changes will provide out-of-state mental health providers with a reduced registration fee to offer teletherapy services in Louisiana. This may benefit Licensed Professional Counselors (LPCs) and Licensed Marriage and Family Therapists (LMFTs) by simplifying the process of practicing in Louisiana, provided they are licensed and in good standing in another jurisdiction. Additionally, this change could benefit Louisiana residents by increasing their access to LPCs and LMFTs.

IV. ESTIMATED EFFECT ON COMPETITION AND EMPLOYMENT (Summary)

The proposed rule changes could impact employment and competition by encouraging individuals from other states to seek registration to provide mental health counseling in Louisiana under the new regulations. However, the overall effect on competition and employment cannot be determined, as it is unclear how many additional individuals will pursue licensure as a result of the proposed changes.
